SPINE LABEL DRAW

PREPARE THE ACTIVITY

- Print and cut 2-3 sets of the <u>number cards</u>.
 Laminate them for longer and repeated use.
- Print out the station directions.
 - Either laminate them, place them in a sign holder, or place in a sheet protector.
 - The directions are available in portrait and landscape to fit your signage needs.
- Place the cut out letter cards on the table, in an envelope, or in a bowl. Any of these make it easier for students to choose one card at a time.

ACTIVITY DIRECTIONS

- Students choose 3 cards. They flip them over as they pull them out.
- This will replicate the first 3 numbers of a call number on a nonfiction book.
- For example, if they pull out 811 they would go to the 800s and find a poetry book.

- Students can work alone or with a partner.
- Challenge students to checkout at least one book from a section they visited.

DEWEY DECIMAL MATCH

ABOUT THE ACTIVITY

This activity helps students learn the Dewey Decimal System.

While they don't need to memorize the DDS, it is helpful for them to understand how nonfiction books are organized.

This helps them find books about the topics they love.

PREPARE THE ACTIVITY

- Print out the <u>station directions</u>.
 - Either laminate them, place them in a sign holder, or place in a sheet protector.
 - The directions are available in portrait and landscape to fit your signage needs.
- Print and laminate the Dewey Mat and cards.

- Students can work alone or with a partner.
- Limit the number of items students sort.

DEWEY DECIMAL SORT

ABOUT THE ACTIVITY

This activity helps students read spine labels so that they know how a nonfiction label looks.

It also helps them learn how nonfiction books are organized in the library.

The same is true for fiction books.

PREPARE THE ACTIVITY

- Print out the station directions...
 - Either laminate them, place them in a sign holder, or place in a sheet protector.
 - The directions are available in portrait and landscape to fit your signage needs.
- Print out the cards. I recommend laminating them.

- Students can work alone or with a partner.
- Assign different amount of cards to complete for different groups of children.
- Decide if you want students to work on fiction, nonfiction, or both.
- Challenge students by having them find the shelves those books are located.

DEWEY SCAVENGER HUNT

ABOUT THE ACTIVITY

This activity helps students learn how to use the library management software to help them find the books they are interested in.

It also helps them differentiate between fiction and nonfiction as they learn how the shelves are organized within the library.

PREPARE THE ACTIVITY

- Print out the station directions.
 - Either laminate them, place them in a sign holder, or place in a sheet protector.
 - The directions are available in portrait and landscape to fit your signage needs.
- Print out the <u>recording sheets</u> for students to complete.

- Students can work alone or with a partner.
- Determine if you want students to focus on fiction, nonfiction, or both.

SHELF ORDER

ABOUT THE ACTIVITY

This activity helps students practice putting books in alphabetical order. This game will help them navigate the shelves as they look for books by the author's last name and within the Dewey Decimal System.

PREPARE THE ACTIVITY

- Print out the <u>station directions</u>.
 - Either laminate them, place them in a sign holder, or place in a sheet protector.
 - The directions are available in portrait and landscape to fit your signage needs.
- This game works better on a computer.
 - If your students don't know how to scan QR Codes, you can scan them yourself with this QR Code to set them up.

DIFFERENTIATING

 Some students will be able to complete this activity without the use of an alphabet chart.

ALPHABET MATCH

PREPARE THE ACTIVITY

- Print and cut the <u>alphabet cards</u>. Laminate them for longer and repeated use.
- Print out the <u>station directions</u>. Write the number of cards they need to complete.
 - Either laminate them, place them in a sign holder, or place in a sheet protector.

 - I will sometimes leave the number blank and write the number on the laminated sheet or sign holder in dry erase marker.




